

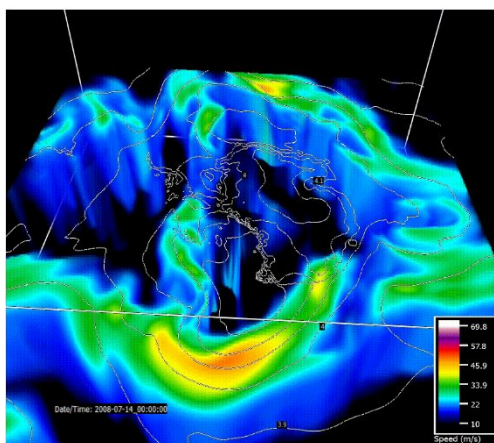


## CCU SUMMER UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

**Overview.** The Coastal Carolina University Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (C-SURF) is a 10-week research program designed primarily for math, physical science, engineering, and computer science students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and have completed at least two years of undergraduate coursework. Jointly operated by the Department of Computing Sciences and the Department of Coastal and Marine Systems Science, C-SURF is supported by the National Science Foundation (NSF) Research Experiences for Undergraduate (REU) program.\* CCU is located near Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

C-SURFers collaborate with researchers on potential projects that integrate computing and geoscience to advance our understanding of the coastal zones, climate variability, weather forecasting, oceanography, big data analytics, and related topics.
